### **About The Panelists**

**Annie Koh** is Associate Professor of Finance and Dean of Office of Executive and Professional Education at the Singapore Management University. She is also concurrently the Associate Dean of the Lee Kong Chian School of Business and Academic Director, International Trading Institute@SMU. She received her PhD in International Finance from New York University (Stern School of Business) in 1988 where she was a Fulbright scholar. Prior to joining the academia, she was a treasury manager at DBS Bank. Annie is frequently sought after as a conference speaker, panel moderator and expert commentator. She also has extensive experience in consulting and executive teaching for regional and international banks, MNCs, government agencies, telecommunication companies, airlines, healthcare and hospitality sector, and not-for-profit organizations. Her articles have been published in The Review of Future Markets, SIMEX Papers, Pulses, and she authored IE Singapore's book on Financing Internationalisation – Growth Strategies for Successful Companies. Her current research interests are in Family Office and Family Business Research, REITS, Investor Behaviour, Alternative Investments, and Enterprise Risk Management. She sits on several advisory boards and steering committees in the financial services and government sectors.

**Su Shan Tan** is a Managing Director at Morgan Stanley as Head of Private Wealth Management for Southeast Asia. Before re-joining Morgan Stanley in May 2008, she was a Region Head for Singapore, Malaysia and Brunei for Citi Private Bank. She was responsible for the private bank's overall business and a board director of Citi Trust Singapore. She was also the Singapore Investment Centre Head.

Prior to that, she was an Executive Director with Morgan Stanley in Singapore, serving from 1997 to 2005 as an investment adviser to high net worth families, corporates and institutions in the region. Before joining Morgan Stanley, she spent 7 years working in key financial hubs around the world. In London, Su Shan helped Baring Securities to develop its institutional equity business for Europe and the Middle-East region. She also spent 4 years working in Tokyo and Hong Kong covering the Asian and Japanese equity markets for ING-Barings.

Su Shan was the founder and founding president of the Financial Women's Association in Singapore. She still sits on the board. Su Shan is also a board member of Aetos Security Management, a wholly-owned subsidiary of Temasek Holdings, the Singaporean government's investment arm. She is also on the investment committee of Ministry of Health Holdings (MOH Holdings) and a board member of the Khoo Teck Puat Hospital. Married with two children, Su Shan is actively involved in fund-raising for various Singaporean charities and sits on the board of Singapore's KK Hospital Health Endowment Fund, which provides financial support to needy patients. She also sits on the board of the National Museum. On the education front, Su Shan sits on the advisory board of 2 schools, Raffles Girls Primary School and SJI International. She is also on the exco of the Young President Organization (YPO) and a member of the International Women Forum (IWF).

**Teresa Lim** is Managing Director of IBM Singapore. Appointed in January 2007, Teresa is responsible for the operations of IBM Singapore, including all product and services division, as well as the company's sales and distribution business.

She was previously the Vice President of ibm.com for Asia Pacific, Director for Marketing Management in Tokyo and Director of Marketing for ASEAN/South Asia in 2000. Since joining IBM Singapore in 1989, Teresa has held several positions in sales, strategic planning, marketing and human resources. Early in her career, she led the corporate organisation transformation initiative for IBM Singapore.

Teresa serves on a number of Boards/Councils including the National Tripartite Committee on Workplace Health, Employer Alliance and the Information Technology Advisory Committee of Nanyang Polytechnic.
